

Whitney started as a volunteer at the Emergency Youth Shelter in January; from the beginning, she thoroughly enjoyed being with the children. As a college student juggling several jobs, she still found time to go bowling with the children on Saturdays or drop off goodies on a Friday afternoon. The children bonded with her as well—they would ask

the shelter staff when Whitney was scheduled to return.

Eventually, one of the shelter employees moved on to another position, leaving a vacancy. Without hesitation, Whitney applied and was immediately hired. When asked about her new job, Whitney made it clear that her purpose is more than just a paycheck:

I have always felt that the opportunity to feel valued gives even the most broken child the ability to persevere. Being a role model and example for these children is who I am supposed to be. This is the most rewarding position I've ever had. I LOVE my job!

This story is not unique; in fact, a recent study by the

Corporation for National and Community Service shows that 27 percent of volunteers are more likely to find a new job than those who do not volunteer.
